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Itinerary Belize central and north region

Day 1: Drowned Cayes After a warm welcome, orientation, and safety briefing, we set sail for the Drowned Cayes. Begin the afternoon with your first dive into the Caribbean Sea, an immersive introduction to Belize's coastal waters. Back on board, enjoy some relaxed casting from the boat while taking in the surrounding scenery. These nutrient-rich waters, influenced by nearby mangroves, support a vibrant marine ecosystem. As evening approaches, unwind on deck with a cocktail in hand and take in a classic Caribbean sunset before dinner under the stars.

Day 2: Gallow's Reef & Caye Caulker Your skipper sets a course for the famous, sleepy island of Caye Caulker. On the way, enjoy some fishing or take a refreshing dip upon arrival. The island's motto is "No shirt, no shoes, no problem," and you will feel that laid-back vibe the moment you step onto its sandy streets. Before we anchor, dive into the waters of Gallow's Reef for a snorkel, or perhaps try your hand at spearfishing for lobster or snapper alongside your captain to catch a fresh Caribbean treat.

Day 3: Caye Caulker Marine Reserve & St. George's Caye Start your day exploring the Caye Caulker Marine Reserve, a kaleidoscope of sea life featuring colorful queen angelfish and vibrant star corals. Later, we sail to the historic St. George's Caye. Once the first capital of the British settlement, this island is now a peaceful retreat for private families. It serves as a perfect, quiet base for a sunset walk along the sandy shores or a final afternoon scuba dive in the crystal-clear depths.

Day 4: The Untouched Colson Cayes Today we visit the magical Colson Cayes, a collection of mangrove islands and sandy inlets that feel like a secret world. This is one of the healthiest reef systems in Belize due to its remote location. Spend hours snorkeling among hard and soft corals, sea fans, and brilliant red sponges. Your yacht provides the perfect platform to relax between swims while watching the local manatees and dolphins play in the distance.

Day 5: Tropical Vibes at Tobacco Caye As the sun rises over the barrier reef, we sail south to the palm-fringed paradise of Tobacco Caye. Perched right on the reef's edge, this 5-acre island is a snorkeler's dream. Let us assist you in finding the best shore-side dive spots, or head to the tiny beach bar for a traditional rum cocktail. With only 39 local islanders living here, it's a wonderful place to soak in the authentic, remote island lifestyle from the comfort of a hammock.

Day 6: Wildlife Wonders at Bluefield Range After a delicious breakfast on deck, we sail to the Bluefield Range. This mangrove cluster is a haven for wildlife and a premier destination for kayaking. Paddle through narrow, emerald channels and look out for the gentle manatees that call this area home. If you're feeling lucky, take some bait and a fishing line along—nothing beats the taste of a dinner caught by your own hand in such an idyllic setting.

Day 7: Postcard-Perfect Goff's Caye & Bannister Today, we visit Goff's Caye—an island so beautiful it reminds us why postcards were invented. This 2-acre gem sits right on the barrier reef, allowing you to snorkel straight from the shore or simply lounge in the shallow sandbar with an icy cold Belikin beer. Later, we sail to Bannister Bogue to visit the "sea cows." Seeing these 3,500-pound gentle giants in their natural habitat is a memory that will stay with you long after you leave.

Day 8: Beautiful Goodbyes Enjoy a final, leisurely sail back to the marina at Old Belize. We are sorry to see your journey end, but we know the magic of these islands will stay in your heart until we meet again!
